





Why do I need to go to the ophtalmologist ?

The ophtalmologist takes care of my eyes.


I need to go to the eye doctor :


To find out if my vision needs correcting.






• To find out if I see straight or not.





• To find out if I have an eye disease.





What happens when I'm there ?

I can have an eye doctor appointment :


at an ophtalmology office

If I have glasses, I should wear them.




I wait for my turn in the waiting room.

• She asks me why I am here.


Do my eyes hurt?


• To check how my eyes are.
